## The Cemetery Club by Ivan Menchell, directed by Sam Hack

September 14 – 24, 2023

Three Jewish widows meet once a month for tea before going to visit their husbands' graves. Ida is sweet tempered and ready to begin a new life; Lucille is a feisty embodiment of the girl who just wants to have fun; and Doris is priggish and judgmental, particularly when Sam the butcher enters the scene. He meets the widows while visiting his wife's grave. This play is genuinely funny while with a serious subject matter. It runs through a range of emotions. There are secrets, some anger, a little bit of betrayal, but a lot of love too.

<u>The Play That Goes Wrong</u> by Henry Lewis, Jonathan Sayer, and Henry Shields, directed by Tim Kelly April 4 – 14, 2024

"Break a leg!" takes on a whole new meaning for a woefully misguided troupe of players at the Cornley University Society's opening night performance of *The Murder at Haversham Manor*. An unconscious leading lady, a corpse who can't play dead, a ruffled detective, and a word-mangling butler (among others) must battle against technical gaffes, forgotten lines, and sabotaging scenery in a quest to arrive all in one piece at the final curtain call. Part Monty Python, part Sherlock Holmes, all mayhem, this 1920s whodunit is disastrously delightful.

## <u>Twelfth Night</u> by William Shakespeare, directed by Heather Sartin

July 11 – 21, 2024

Written between 1601-1602, the second play in Shakespeare's Shipwreck Trilogy, "Twelfth Night" remains one of the Bard's most familiar and best- loved comedies. Sword fights, long lost twins, singing, dancing, and yellow socks all work together to weave a tale of restoration and love. Complete with mistaken identities, misguided romance, misplaced affection and a "mis" terious love letter, this play makes as easy an introduction to Shakespeare's works as it does an evening with a familiar friend. No matter your level of Shakespearean comfort, audiences will find "Twelfth Night" to be clever, joyful, and poignant ... filled with laugh-out-loud frivolity alongside some of the most beautiful lines of poetry ever penned.
